# หมวดที่ 2 ข้อมูลเฉพาะของหมวดวิชาศึกษาทั่วไป

## 1. หลักการและเหตุผลในการปรับปรุง

การจัดการศึกษาแบบมุ่งเน้นผลลัพธ์การเรียนรู้ (Outcome-based Education) และการจัดการเรียนรู้ แบบใช้สมรรถนะเป็นฐาน (Competency-based Learning) ที่ดำเนินการในสถาบันเทคโนโลยีพระจอมเกล้า เจ้าคุณทหารลาดกระบัง มุ่งเน้นให้นักศึกษาได้ฝึกทักษะต่างๆ เพื่อสร้างบัณฑิตที่มีความสามารถและทักษะที่ ใช้ได้จริงในยุคศตวรรษที่ 21 โดยกลุ่มรายวิชาศึกษาทั่วไปเป็นกลุ่มรายวิชามุ่งเน้นการพัฒนาทักษะของ นักศึกษาให้เป็นผู้ที่มีความสามารถในการแสวงหาความรู้เพื่อสามารถดำรงชีวิตได้ในศตวรรษที่ 21 มีทักษะ พื้นฐานสำหรับการพัฒนาตนเองและส่งเสริมความก้าวหน้าทางวิชาชีพ มีทักษะด้านการจัดการและมีภาวะ ความเป็นผู้นำ มีทักษะในการสื่อสาร มีความสามารถในการใช้เทคโนโลยีสารสนเทศ และเป็นผู้ดำเนินชีวิต ตามอัตลักษณ์ของสถาบัน "ชื่อสัตย์ ใฝ่รู้ สู้งาน"

การปรับปรุงหมวดวิชาศึกษาทั่วไปของ สจล. ฉบับปรับปรุง พ.ศ. 2566 ดำเนินการตามมาตรฐานหลักสูตร การศึกษาระดับอุดมศึกษา พ.ศ. 2565 และ เกณฑ์มาตรฐานหลักสูตรระดับปริญญาตรี พ.ศ. 2565 และการจัด การศึกษาในหมวดนี้ยังเป็นไปตามกรอบมาตรฐานคุณวุฒิระดับอุดมศึกษาแห่งชาติ พ.ศ. 2565 ซึ่งมุ่งเน้น ผลลัพธ์การเรียนรู้ (Learning Outcomes) ของบัณฑิตอย่างน้อยสี่ด้าน ดังต่อไปนี้ ด้านความรู้ ด้านทักษะ ด้านจริยธรรม ด้านลักษณะบุคคล โดยแบ่งผลลัพธ์การเรียนรู้ของหมวดวิชาศึกษาทั่วไปเป็น 11 กลุ่มทักษะ (KMITL General Education Skills) ดังนี้

- 1. การคิดวิเคราะห์และการคิดอย่างมีวิจารณญาณ (Analytical and Critical Thinking)
- 2. การแก้ปัญหาเชิงซับซ้อน (Complex Problem Solving)
- 3. การคิดสร้างสรรค์ (Creative Thinking)
- 4. การบริหารความสัมพันธ์กับผู้อื่น (Interpersonal Management)
- 5. ความซื่อสัตย์และความพากเพียรพยายาม (Integrity and Perseverance)
- 6 .การเรียนรู้เชิงรุกและการใฝ่รู้ (Active Learning & Learning Strategies)
- 7. ความอดทน ยืดหยุ่น และพื้นตัวจากสภาวะความเครียด (Resilience, Stress, Tolerance and Flexibility)
- 8. การเป็นผู้นำและผู้เปลี่ยนแปลงสังคม (Leadership and Social Influence)
- 9. การสื่อสารอย่างมีประสิทธิภาพ (Effective Communication)
- 10. การเป็นผู้ประกอบการและการลงทุน (Entrepreneurship and Investment)
- 11. การรู้ เท่าทันดิจิทัลและการผลิตสื่อดิจิทัล (Digital Quotient Literacy and Digital Media Production)

จากหลักการและเหตุผลดังกล่าวข้างต้น หมวดวิชาศึกษาทั่วไป ฉบับปรับปรุง พ.ศ.2566 จึงได้รับการ ออกแบบที่โดดเด่น มีความทันสมัยโดยเน้นเรื่องของการพัฒนาทักษะเป็นหลัก แต่ยังคงมีเป้าหมายที่ครอบคลุม หลักการต่างๆไว้อย่างครบถ้วน เพื่อสร้างบัณฑิตให้สามารถดำรงชีวิตอยู่ในศตวรรษที่ 21 อย่างมีคุณภาพ

# 2. ปรัชญาของหมวดวิชาศึกษาทั่วไป

หมวดวิชาที่เสริมสร้างความเป็นมนุษย์ที่สมบูรณ์ ให้พร้อมสำหรับโลกในปัจจุบันและอนาคต เพื่อให้เป็น บุคคลผู้ใฝ่รู้และมีทักษะทางสังคม (Soft Skills) ที่จำเป็นสำหรับศตวรรษที่ 21 อย่างครบถ้วน เป็นผู้มีความ รอบรู้อย่างกว้างขวาง เข้าใจ และเห็นคุณค่าของตนเอง ผู้อื่น สังคม ศิลปวัฒนธรรม และธรรมชาติ สามารถ บูรณาการศาสตร์ต่างๆ ในการพัฒนา หรือแก้ไขปัญหา เป็นผู้ที่ใส่ใจต่อความเปลี่ยนแปลงของสรรพสิ่ง พัฒนา ตนเองอย่างต่อเนื่อง พร้อมให้ความช่วยเหลือเพื่อนมนุษย์ เป็นพลเมืองที่เข้มแข็ง รู้คุณค่าและรักษ์ชาติกำเนิด ดำเนินชีวิตอย่างมีคุณธรรมจริยธรรม และเป็นพลเมืองที่มีคุณค่าของสังคมไทยและสังคมโลก

# 3. วัตถุประสงค์ของหมวดวิชาศึกษาทั่วไป

- 1. เพื่อให้นักศึกษาได้รับการพัฒนาและฝึกฝนทักษะที่จำเป็นในศตวรรษที่ 21 รวมทั้งการปลูกฝังอัต ลักษณ์ของสถาบันฯ ที่สะท้อนถึงคุณลักษณะความซื่อสัตย์ ใฝ่รู้ สู้งาน และการเรียนรู้ตลอดชีวิต
- 2. เพื่อให้นักศึกษาได้รับการพัฒนาและฝึกฝนทักษะด้านบุคคลที่เกี่ยวข้องกับกระบวนการคิด อารมณ์ ความรู้สึก รวมถึงทักษะการเรียนรู้ตลอดชีวิต เพื่อให้นักศึกษาเป็นผู้ตระหนักรู้ถึงการบูรณาการศาสตร์ ต่างๆ ในการพัฒนา หรือแก้ไขปัญหา
- 3. เพื่อให้นักศึกษาได้รับการพัฒนาและฝึกฝนทักษะด้านการจัดการและภาวะความเป็นผู้นำ รวมทั้ง ทักษะการเป็นผู้ประกอบการยุคใหม่ เพื่อให้นักศึกษาสามารถปรับตัวเข้ากับโลกที่มีความเปลี่ยนแปลง ตลอดเวลา สามารถดำรงตนเป็นพลเมืองที่เข้มแข็ง ดำเนินชีวิตอย่างมีคุณธรรมจริยธรรม และเป็น พลเมืองที่มีคุณค่าของสังคมไทยและสังคมโลก
- 4. เพื่อให้นักศึกษาได้รับการพัฒนาและฝึกฝนทักษะด้านภาษาและการสื่อสารซึ่งเป็นเครื่องมือสำคัญใน การดำรงชีวิตและการทำงาน เพื่อให้นักศึกษาเป็นผู้สื่อสารที่ดี สามารถฟังอย่างอย่างลึกซึ้ง และ สื่อสารได้อย่างมีคุณภาพทั้งทางวัจนภาษา และ อวัจนภาษา
- 5. เพื่อให้นักศึกษาได้รับการพัฒนาทักษะที่จำเป็นต่อการใช้ชีวิตในอนาคต เพื่อให้นักศึกษาทักษะในการ ใช้เทคโนโลยีสารสนเทศรวมถึงการตระหนักรู้ทางด้านดิจิทัล

# 6. อาจารย์ผู้สอน

อาจารย์ผู้สอนในหมวดวิชาศึกษาทั่วไป ได้แก่ อาจารย์ประจำของสถาบันเทคโนโลยีพระจอมเกล้าเจ้าคุณ ทหารลาดกระบังจากทุกคณะ/วิทยาลัย/วิทยาเขต โดยอาจมีวิทยากร และอาจารย์พิเศษที่สถาบันฯ เชิญเป็น ผู้สอนตามความเหมาะสมและความจำเป็น

## 7. นักศึกษา

หลักสูตรปรับปรุงใหม่จะใช้สำหรับนักศึกษาเข้าศึกษาที่สถาบันฯ ในปีการศึกษา 2566 เป็นต้นไป โดย นักศึกษาที่เข้าศึกษาในสถาบันฯ ก่อนปีการศึกษา 2566 สามารถลงทะเบียนเรียนและเทียบโอนรายวิชา หรือ เลือกลงทะเบียนเรียนเป็นวิชาเลือกเสรีได้ นอกจากนี้ยังเปิดให้บุคคลภายนอกที่มีความสนใจในการพัฒนา ทักษะ (Upskill/Reskill) สามารถเลือกเรียนในรูปแบบการสะสมหน่วยกิตได้

# หมวดที่ 3 ระบบการจัดการศึกษา การดำเนินการและโครงสร้างของหมวดวิชาศึกษาทั่วไป

## 1. ระบบการจัดการศึกษา

โดยทั่วไป ใช้ระบบการศึกษาแบบทวิภาค โดยใน 1 ปีการศึกษาแบ่งเป็น 2 ภาคการศึกษา ในแต่ละภาค การศึกษามีระยะเวลาการศึกษาไม่น้อยกว่า 15 สัปดาห์หรืออาจยืดหยุ่นในการจัดเวลาเรียนแต่ต้องเก็บสะสม เวลาเรียนให้ครบเทียบเท่ากับหน่วยกิตของวิชานั้นๆ ทั้งนี้ในภาคการศึกษาพิเศษอาจมีการจัดการเรียนการ สอน ซึ่งข้อกำหนดต่างๆ เป็นไปตามข้อบังคับสถาบันฯ ว่าด้วยการศึกษาระดับปริญญาตรี พ.ศ. 2559

# 2. การดำเนินการหลักสูตร

2.1 สำหรับรายวิชาที่เปิดในสถาบัน ๆ จะเปิดสอนและวัดผลในวันและเวลาทำการของสถาบันๆ โดยสำนัก วิชาศึกษาทั่วไปเป็นผู้ประกาศตารางสอนและตารางสอบวิชาศึกษาทั่วไปในระบบของสำนักทะเบียนๆ 2.2 สำหรับการเทียบโอนหน่วยกิตจากการศึกษาในรูปแบบอื่นๆ ให้เป็นไปตาม ข้อบังคับสถาบันๆ ว่า ด้วยการศึกษาระดับปริญญาตรี โดยจะต้องผ่านการพิจารณาจากคณะกรรมการของสำนักวิชาศึกษา ทั่วไป

## 3. ค่าน้ำหนักของทักษะตามรายวิชา

เนื่องจากรายวิชาศึกษาทั่วไปเป็นการวัดผลด้วยทักษะ (Skill-based approach) การกำหนดเกณฑ์เพื่อใช้ ในการพัฒนาผลลัพธ์การเรียนรู้และประเมินสำหรับแต่ละรายวิชามีดังนี้

- 1. วิชาแต่ละวิชาจะมีค่าน้ำหนักรวมของทักษะที่ต้องการวัด 15 หน่วย (เป็นเกณฑ์ที่ตั้งขึ้นเพื่อให้สามารถ นำมาใช้ คำนวณสำหรับการวัดผลรายวิชา)
- 2. ผู้ออกแบบรายวิชาจะใช้เกณฑ์นี้ในการกำหนดค่าน้ำหนักของแต่ละทักษะที่ต้องการพัฒนา
- 3. เมื่อแบ่งสัดส่วนค่าน้ำหนักของแต่ละทักษะที่ต้องการพัฒนา จะนำไปสู่การออกแบบกิจกรรมเพื่อ พัฒนาผลลัพธ์การเรียนรู้ที่เหมาะสมต่อไป ค่าน้ำหนักที่กระจายไม่จำเป็นต้องเป็นทักษะใดทักษะหนึ่ง หรือไม่จำเป็นต้องเป็นการกระจายอย่างสม่ำเสมอเท่า ๆ กันในทุก ๆ ทักษะ แต่เป็นวิธีการกระจายค่า น้ำหนักตามสัดส่วนที่รายวิชานั้น ๆ มุ่งเน้น

เนื่องจากทุกรายวิชาจะค่าน้ำหนักทั้งสิ้น 15 หน่วยเท่า ๆ กัน ดังนั้นค่าน้ำหนักจริงของแต่ละรายวิชาจะ เท่ากับค่าน้ำหนักในแต่ละทักษะคูณกับหน่วยกิตของรายวิชานั้น ๆ แล้วหารด้วย 3 จึงทำให้เมื่อนักศึกษาเรียน ครบตามเกณฑ์ (24 หน่วยกิต) แล้ว นักศึกษาจะมีผลน้ำหนักรวมของทุกทักษะเท่ากับ 120 หน่วย


## 4. กลยุทธ์การสอน

เพื่อให้การจัดการเรียนการสอนเป็นไปตามผลลัพธ์การเรียนรู้ที่ตั้งไว้ คณาจารย์ผู้สอนในหมวดวิชาศึกษา ทั่วไปปรับเปลี่ยนกลยุทธ์การสอนและการประเมินเพื่อการวัดผลอย่างมีประสิทธิภาพ โดยการเรียนการสอนจะ เป็นแบบเชิงรุก (Active Learning) คณาจารย์ผู้สอนทำหน้าที่เป็นผู้นำแนวทาง (Facilitator) ไม่เน้นการสอน แบบบรรยายตลอดเวลา เน้นให้นักศึกษาคิด เรียนจากบริบทที่ค้นคว้า (Teach Less Learn more) และเน้น สร้างกระบวนการเรียนรู้ (Process-based Learning) โดยฝึกให้นักศึกษาได้เข้าใจกระบวนการวิธีคิด ค้นคว้า ต่อยอดองค์ความรู้ในรายวิชาต่างๆ และเน้นให้นักศึกษาได้ทำกิจกรรมส่งเสริมการเรียนรู้ การลงมือปฏิบัติ เพื่อให้เข้าใจเนื้อหาองค์ความรู้อย่างชัดเจน (Learning by Doing) สำหรับการประเมินผลลัพธ์การเรียนรู้ จะ เน้นประเมินจากการลงมือปฏิบัติตลอดระยะเวลาของการเรียนการสอน (Formative Assessment) ร่วมกับ การใช้ข้อสอบวัดผลลัพธ์การเรียนรู้เมื่อเรียนจบรายวิชา (Summative Assessment) โดยสัดส่วนหลักจะเน้น ที่ผลจากการปฏิบัติมากกว่าการสอบ

## 5. กลยุทธ์การประเมิน

สำหรับการประเมินผลลัพธ์การเรียนรู้ในทุกด้าน จะเน้นประเมินจากการลงมือปฏิบัติหรือการทำกิจกรรม ในชั้นเรียนตลอดระยะเวลาของการเรียนการสอน (Formative Assessment) ร่วมกับการใช้ข้อสอบวัดผล ลัพธ์การเรียนรู้เมื่อเรียนจบรายวิชา (Summative Assessment) โดยสัดส่วนหลักจะเน้นที่ผลจากการปฏิบัติ มากกว่าการสอบ ทั้งนี้ การประเมินทั้งสองแบบจะใช้เครื่องมือที่วัดได้เพื่อให้เกิดการประเมินผลที่ถูกต้องและ แม่นยำ

สำหรับการประเมินแบบ Formative Assessment โดยการเน้นประเมินทักษะ จะมีการใช้รูบริคเพื่อให้ เกิดการวัดระดับทักษะได้อย่างแท้จริง เมื่อนักศึกษาเรียนครบตามเกณฑ์ที่กำหนด และได้รับการประเมินการ เรียนรู้แล้ว นักศึกษาจะได้ทราบถึงการพัฒนาทักษะทั้ง 11 ด้านในรูปแบบ Skills Mapping ภาพรวมของ ทักษะตามที่ได้ศึกษามา

96641005 TEAM-PROJECT 2 1 (0-2-1)

PREREQUISITE: 96641004 TEAM-PROJECT 1 or EQUIVALENT SUBJECT

Small teams of students undertake the design, implementation, testing, evaluation, and presentation of a specific project of size and complexity suitable for novice students.

96641006 TEAM-PROJECT 3 1 (0-2-1)

PREREQUISITE: 96641005 TEAM-PROJECT 2 or EQUIVALENT SUBJECT

Small teams of students undertake the design, implementation, testing, evaluation, and presentation of a complete project/product/service.

96641007 DIGITAL CITIZEN 3 (3-0-6)

PREREQUISITE: NONE

Development of digital citizen skills, live safely and responsibly online, use technology creatively and morally, innovate and deliver digital media sensibly, understand modern investment, and live wisely in digital world.

96641009 INTERCULTURAL COMMUNICATION SKILLS IN ENGLISH 1 3 (3-0-6)

PREREQUISITE: NONE

A development of intercultural communication competences through practices of English language communication with emphasis on listening practices, basic reading comprehension, idea summary, expressing opinions, in-group presentation, and basic paragraph writing skills.

96641010 INTERCULTURAL COMMUNICATION SKILLS IN ENGLISH 2 3 (3-0-6)

PREREQUISITE: INTERCULTURAL COMMUNICATION SKILLS IN ENGLISH 1

A development of intercultural communication competences through practices of English language communication with emphasis on listening practices, analytic reading, group discussions, public speaking, and different writing techniques such as expository writing, descriptive writing, persuasive writing, and narrative writing.

#### PERSONAL AND PROFESSIONAL SKILLS

96642001 PRACTICE UNDER PERSONAL AND PROFESSIONAL SKILLS 1 1 (0-2-1)

PREREQUISITE: NONE

This course provides practice for working or industrial training or training or other related activities which reflect development of the personal and professional support skills at least 15 hours.

96642002 PRACTICE UNDER PERSONAL AND PROFESSIONAL SKILLS 2 2 (0-4-2)

PREREQUISITE: NONE

This course provides practice for working or industrial training or training or other related activities which reflect development of the personal and professional support skills at least 30 hours.

96642012 **DESIGN THINKING**  3 (3-0-6)

PREREOUISITE: NONE

Learn design thinking process and develop problem-solving skills by studying target group behavior, defining problem, using mind map. Learn techniques for interviewing and group discussion. Practice ideation which leads to creative solutions. Build, present and test prototypes and concepts of design. Learn to apply design thinking process to daily life and create innovation.

96642013 INTEGRATED THINKING 3 (3-0-6)

PREREOUISITE: NONE

Study principles and various types of thinking; positive thinking lateral thinking, critical thinking, analytical thinking. Learn to develop thinking process through questioning, analyzing, synthesizing and evaluating. Learn to express logical ideas and create workpiece based on own thought.

96642014 INNOVATIVE AND SYSTEM THINKING 3 (3-0-6)

PREREQUISITE: NONE

Creativity and innovativity; features of innovativity; innovative methods, motivation, example of innovation in health sciences, conceptual of systems thinking framework; principle of systems thinking; pattern of systems thinking, key phases of systems thinking approach, systems thinking design, example of systems thinking.

#### 96642015 CREATIVE THINKING AND INNOVATION

3 (3-0-6)

PREREQUISITE: NONE

Process thinking, creative thinking, innovation, problem solving, applications of creative thinking and innovation to learning, applications of creative thinking and innovation to living.

#### 96642017 INNOVATION UNBOXED

3 (3-0-6)

PREREQUISITE: NONE

Study importance and necessity of innovation; analysis of important concepts, theories, and principles concerning a development of innovation; usefulness of innovation to all levels of development, and study positive and negative factors on the development of innovation, with an adaptation or change in perspective to achieve innovative mindset, principles on analysis, synthesis, integration, and formation of innovation, and innovations from variety of applications of knowledge to various issues and situations.

#### 96642018 CREATIVE PRODUCTION TECHNOLOGY

3 (3-0-6)

PREREQUISITE: NONE

A technology production for the creative process, are transcribed as learning of production tools, and methods of creative productions. Techniques in manufacturing processes and both traditional and innovative methods and tools are explored to define aesthetic perception and practices employ for production as art and design solution.

#### 96642019 BASIC CREATIVE STEM DESIGN

3 (3-0-6)

PREREQUISITE: NONE

This is the first course in the two-course sequence constructed to give engineering students a chance to experience real-world design challenge using project-based learning. Students team up to work on short STEM (science, technology, engineering and mathematics) projects. Students will learn the overall design process, framing the problem, schedule planning, creating prototype, as well as learning how to communicate their ideas to audience via meetings, reports, and oral presentations. The course should be taken during freshmen year.

#### 96642020 ADVANCE CREATIVE STEM DESIGN

3 (3-0-6)

PREREQUISITE: NONE

Study the trend of junk accumulation such as unwanted items, observe and understand buyer's behavior as well as manufacturer's viewpoints in order to employ creativity to reduce junks, seek personal creative thinking to reduce junks, including learn system of design thinking and turn creative ideas into new design items.

#### 96642022 PHILOSOPHY OF SCIENCE

3 (3-0-6)

PREREQUISITE: NONE

The course provides a study of the thing we call "science", together with its nature and methodology. The topics cover the meaning of science, reality, the nature of scientific observations, scientific theories and their discovery and formation, scientific explanations and predictions, the problem of induction, scientific rationality, the nature of scientific knowledge, concepts of truth, hypothesis testing, hypothesis confirmation, hypothesis falsification, logic of scientific method, and scientific progress.

#### 96642024 PROFESSIONAL INFORMATION ANALYSIS AND ACADEMIC PRESENTATION

3 (3-0-6)

PREREQUISITE: NONE

Study information database; statistical analysis software for data analysis; scientific literature and information database; statistical analysis software for data analysis; scientific references; plagiarism prevention; scientific methodology and Interpretation; international scientific communication and presentation.

#### 96642025 FACTS BEHIND NUMBERS

3 (3-0-6)

PREREQUISITE: NONE

Study and practice about the data and information indifferent perspective focusing on number, the approach to collect the data, to analyze data, to interpret the analyzed data and to present the result.

#### 96642026 RESEARCH SKILL DEVELOPMENT

3 (3-0-6)

PREREQUISITE: NONE

Professional practice for research, problem formulation, analysis and problem solving skills, research planning, literature review, scientific citation database, keywords, citation software, professional writing, note-taking skills, summarizing main ideas, experimental design, reasoning and discussion, drawing conclusion, professional presentation, creativity and innovation, patents and patent search, research ethics.

#### 96642028 GAMBLING LITERACY

3 (3-0-6)

PREREQUISITE: NONE

Learn and analyze gambling patterns, methods of play, probability of winning and losing, causes of addiction, and study possible consequences from real case studies which affects lives and create innovation for gambling prevention.

#### 96642029 MEDICAL ETHICS, LAWS AND PROFESSIONALISM

3 (2-2-5)

PREREQUISITE: NONE

Study and develop of medicine as the profession, attributes of the healer, attributes of the professional, code of conducts, self-regulation and social accountability; principles of medical ethics; concepts of autonomy, beneficence, non-maleficence, and justice; concepts of deontology, teleology, and virtue theory; ethics and religions; basic knowledge in civil and criminal laws; professional and related medical laws; disclosure of medical errors; medicolegal and ethical dilemma

#### 96642030 ENGINEERING ETHICS AND LAW

3 (3-0-6)

PREREQUISITE: NONE

Role of Thai Engineer, Engineering ethics, Council of Engineers, Engineer Act., Professional Engineer, Regulation of the council of engineer, Other laws relating to profession.

96642031 PROFESSIONAL ETHICS AND LAWS 3 (3-0-6)

PREREQUISITE: NONE

This course introduces the theory and the practice of professional and overall ethics and laws for professional including code of conducts and regulations in academic, professional and technical fields. Students also learn about different approaches to ethical problems and examine real-life case studies, drawn from a variety of professional contexts. This course helps students develop skills and knowledge to manage and engage with ethical issues in their working lives.

PREREQUISITE: NONE

Study the principles of business foundations in modern business organizations. 96642033 LAW FOR NEW GENERATION 3 (3-0-6)

PREREQUISITE: NONE

Study the laws and analysis facts of law in our society, learning about civic right and responsibilities in expression of opinion, defamation when using online media under acts of computer and digital media use, principles of consumers' protection laws and relevant copyright laws.

96642034 LAW AND REGULATION IN AVIATION INDUSTRY 3 (3-0-6)

PREREQUISITE: NONE

International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) and other international and European organizations' air law. Aviation regulators in Thailand. Legal and institutional framework of international air law regimes. Impacts of air law towards aviation industry. Legal issues in aviation industry.

96642035 INDUSTRIAL EXPERIENCE FOR ENGINEERS 3 (0-18-0)

PREREQUISITE: NONE

Exposure to Professional Practice (EPP), or Industrial Experience (IE), provides an opportunity to gain valuable hands-on training and experience in real world situations. Additionally, through exposure to current practice, students can reflect on, and appreciate the linkage between curriculum and practice. This is an advance to the Internship and Co-op Education. Students will develop specific skills both on engineering and professionals including hands-on experience required to their professional careers.

96642036 PRE-ACTIVITIES FOR ENGINEERS 1 (0-3-0)

PREREQUISITE: NONE

Participates in activities organized by the Faculty of Engineering of advising and preparing students for successful Engineering education and career. Fundamental Laboratory and project in science and technology.

96642037 PROFESSIONAL SKILLS AND ISSUES

3 (3-0-6)

PREREQUISITE: NONE

This course introduces the social, ethical, legal, and professional issues involved in the widespread deployment of information technology. It teaches students to develop their own, well-argued positions on many of these issues.

96642038 OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH

3 (3-0-6)

PREREQUISITE: NONE
